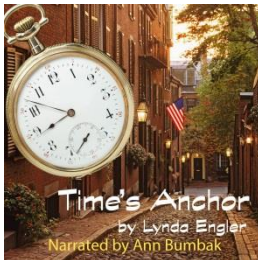

***Time's Anchor* for Audible**

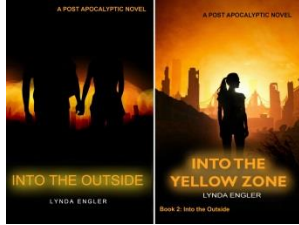
Adult/Time Travel

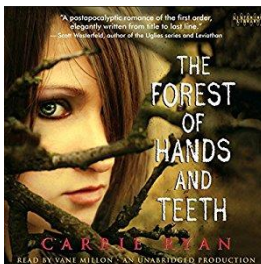

AUDIOBOOK Recommendation

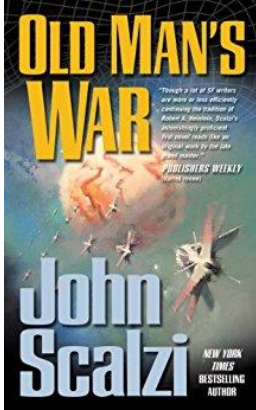
[The Forest of Hands and Teeth](#), by Carrie Ryan

This YA dystopian novel from fellow North Carolinian Carrie Ryan is a must read for all fans of the genre. Vane Millon narrates the story of Mary, who lives behind the fence that protects them from the Forest of Hands and Teeth. As Mary learns about the secrets of the Sisterhood and the power of the Guardians, the truths of her world begin to fail her. When the fence is breached, she must make decisions between her village and those she loves and the outside world that she knows nothing about.

This post-apocalyptic story is populated by a host of heroic characters and one selfish girl. The narration was excellent, the narrator having a slight Latin accent making it a bit different than the usual American or British narrators I am used to hearing. The characters are well developed and interesting but I found a hole in the plot about the villages that was never answered. Overall, I would recommend the audio book.

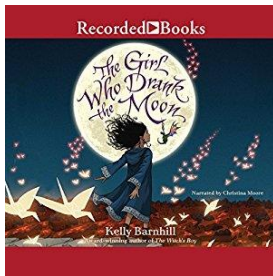


Book Review: [Old Man's War](#), by John Scalzi
Sci-Fi/Space Opera

Overall ****

The first of a 6 book series, *Old Man's War* tells the story of widower John Perry, who with the promise of being made young again, joins the army on his 75th birthday. Humanity finally made it into interstellar space but planets that are fit to live on are scarce and aliens willing to fight for them are common. The universe, it turns out, is a hostile place. So, we fight. To defend Earth (a target for our new enemies, should we let them get close enough) and to stake our own claim to planetary real estate. Far from Earth, the war has gone on for decades: brutal, bloody, unyielding.

I don't generally read military fiction, but I've enjoyed so many of Scalzi's other books (*Agent to the Stars*, *Redshirts*, *Lock In*, and *Muse of Fire* to name just a few) that I thought I would give it a go. I wasn't disappointed. Scalzi writes in his usual easy-going and often irreverent manner. The characters are interesting, the pace is perfect, and the plot – though far from ground-breaking – is captivating as the story evolves.
