

Well-written with nicely sustained suspense

In Time's Like These, by Nathan Van Coops

After a near-electrocution on a softball field in Florida, Ben Travers and his friends wake up in the 80s. Once they figure out where and when they are, they search for a way home, finding other time travelers along the way, including a few that wind up dead. When Ben meets an enigmatic scientist and his charming, time-traveling daughter, salvation seems at hand, but escaping the dangers of the past may lead to a deadly future. If he hopes to save his friends and get everyone home to the future they remember, Ben must learn to master space and time, and survive a journey where past and future violently collide.

This novel was well-written and engaging. I enjoyed the trip down memory lane to my own life in the 1980s, minus the 'stuck in the past" part of course! Nathan Van Coops is a young author to keep an eye on. I look forward to more of his work!
